### I-Cup

An ever improving young Bermudan squad defeated Canada in their I-Cup match played in Toronto, Canada July 4-7. Bermuda defeated Canada by 106 runs in a low scoring contest. Dwayne Leverock took 10 wickets in the match to capture Man of the Match honours. Canada went down to a second defeat at the hands of Scotland. This time the margin of victory was substantial as Scotland won by an innings and 165 runs.

The current standings find Canada and Bermuda tied with 26 points at the bottom of the points table.

Six teams will compete for the Americas U15 Championship in Bermuda August 4-10, 2008. Teams representing the Bahamas, Bermuda, Canada, Cayman Islands and USA will be joined by a Development X1. Pre-tournament favourites Bermuda will have stiff competition from defending champion USA and an improving squad from Canada.

### Academy

Twelve U19 players from five countries will spend ten days of intense training at the National Cricket Complex in Trinidad from August 5-16. A detailed program was put together by Head Coach Kelvin Williams.

## **CHILE**

The Chilean Cricket Association took a massive stride forward this month as the Ministry of Sport in Chile (ChileDeportes) agreed to sponsor the Chilean Cricket Association. ChileDeportes has agreed to supply Cricket Chile with backing letters which will allow the national cricket association to approach major sponsors for more funding. Whilst ChileDeportes will not be directly funding any cricket projects for 2008, the move is the first step towards receiving funding and should see Cricket Chile in a position to apply for significant funding in 2009.

The agreement is the fruit of many hours of groundwork by NDO Patricio Caamano, who had several crucial meetings with Jaime Pizarro, the Minister for Sport in Chile.

### **Local University supports Winter Academy**

The winter training program received a welcome boost as the Universidad de las Americas agreed to allow the junior training squads full access to their sporting facilities, both in Santiago and Vina del Mar.

## **PERU**

It has been a relatively quiet July for Peruvian cricket but there are plenty of activities in the pipeline. An application has been made to the ICC for a special grant to help construct cricket nets in the Hiram Bingham School in Lima. Construction is planned to start in

late August. It is hoped that these facilities will provide excellent training facilities, particularly during the off-season.

Plans are also afoot to begin schools coaching. Miles Buesst completed last year's Beginners Course and will take on a role in the coming months. There has also been some interest shown from other parties abroad. Markham College will again run a cricket activity this term and the first schools game for (at least) 30 years is planned in late August between Markham College and Cambridge College.



## SURINAME

Mr. Akbal Mohamed, member of the Holland Cricket Association (KNCB) has visited Suriname and had a meeting with the Surinamese Cricket Association about having cooperation between the two Associations. It is agreed that further meetings will be held on the subject.
